
Hello Team:

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

The next explains how to set an "Out-of-Office" reply from your email. You should do this whenever you are out-of-the office and this should include information on who is backing up your functions in your absence.

And last is the method to set up Microsoft TEAMS on your computer. TEAMS breaks down the boundaries between locations and helps us all work and communicate together as a TEAM. You can use this tool for instant messaging, internal calls, video conferencing, screen sharing, and set up of collaborating work groups.

Giving Tuesday is on its way! On Tuesday, December 1st, Head Start will be asking for donations for Giving Tuesday. If you are interested in and able to donate, on December 1st, please head to our Facebook page titled Community Action of Orleans & Genesee (you can search for us using Facebook's search bar). One of our first posts should have a Donate button attached to it. Click on this and you will be taken to a form where you can enter your payment information and the amount you wish to donate. This is a safe and secure way to make a donation. If you are unable to donate, please share our donation post by clicking the Share button!

- 1. We are also looking for anyone interested in running their own donation campaign. It's much easier than it sounds check the instructions we've included! Log into Facebook if you have not already.
- 2. Click on where it says "What's on your mind, [name]?"
- 3. In the box that opens, you will see an "Add to your post" box. There should be three dots indicating a "More" option. Click on this, and choose the "Raise Money" option.
- 4. In the "Search for a nonprofit to support" box, type "Community Action of Orleans and Genesee" and choose our organization.
- 5. Next, type your status to indicate to your friends that you are raising money for Head Start, why, and that you would appreciate their help by either donating or sharing your post. Sample text: "Today I am raising money for my local Head Start program to help low-income families receive a quality preschool education. Please donate if you are able to, and share this post to get the word out. Thank you so much for your help!" If you can make the post more personal to you, that's even better.
- 6. Before you post, look under your name on the post to see what your privacy settings are. It may say, "Friends", "Public", "Friends except...", or something else. If it is not set to Public, please set it to Public by clicking on it and selecting the "Public" option. This allows your friends to share your post. (Please note that if you do not prefer to have all of your posts be Public, you will have to change your settings back to your preferred settings when you make your next non-Public post.)
- 7. Click the "Post" button to create your fundraiser.
- 8. Facebook suggests that when you start a fundraiser, that you make the first donation yourself to encourage other people to also donate. If you would like to do this, go to the post you just made and click the "Donate" button. This will take you to a page where you can enter in the dollar amount you would like to donate as well as your payment information. (This is a secured, safe way to pay.)
- 9. You can share your own post throughout the day to make sure your friends see your post. You can do this by going to your post, clicking the "Share" button, and choosing either the "Share Now" button, which shares your post exactly as it is, or the "Share to News Feed" button which allows you to write additional text (if you would like to update your friends on how much you have raised, or if you would like to thank them, for example).
- 10. That's it! You don't have to do anything else, Facebook and its nonprofit program Network for Good will take care of the payments and distributing the money to our Community Action.

- We've also included instructions for how to use AmazonSmile to donate a portion of your Amazon purchases towards Community Action! This is an incredibly easy way to help our organization while doing your regular shopping. If you use Amazon for holiday shopping, make sure it's through AmazonSmile! Go to smile.amazon.com.
- 2. Click the "Get Started" or "Sign in" button.
- 3. It will prompt you to type in the email or phone number associated with your Amazon account; enter it.
- 4. Enter your password.
- 5. It should take you to a "Start by picking your charity" page. Type "Community Action of Orleans and Genesee" into the search bar.
- 6. Choose our organization from the list by clicking the "Select" button.
- 7. Check the box that says "Yes, I understand that I must always start at smile.amazon.com to support Community Action of Orleans and Genesee Inc."
- 8. From now on, whenever you shop using AmazonSmile, Amazon will donate 0.5% of your eligible purchases toward our organization. This does not cost you any extra. However, this only works when you shop through AmazonSmile, not regular Amazon. To make sure you are shopping through AmazonSmile, type smile.amazon.com into your address bar, go to the page, and then drag the icon next to the address bar into your Bookmarks bar. Whenever you're ready to shop, click on your Bookmarked page and it will take you right to AmazonSmile.
- 9. You can also use AmazonSmile on your Amazon app if you have an Android device with version 5.0 or newer, or on iOS devices with version 12 or newer. Go to the Settings on your app by tapping the three lines in the lower right corner, tapping on Settings, tapping on AmazonSmile, and tapping "Turn on AmazonSmile."
- 10. If you would like to use AmazonSmile on your mobile device but do not have the versions mentioned above, go to your web browser and type in smile.amazon.com and use it that way instead.
