- Bonnie Malakie- Director of Children and Youth Services. There are currently no changes but I will be working closely with
 Bonnie and the team throughout 2022 to explore ways to optimize this large part of our organization. There is so much talent
 and opportunity that we can align while we more evenly distribute workload. I look forward to exciting enhancements and
 opportunities in this area over the new year.

TAX APPOINTMENTS at COMMUNITY ACTION Call 343-7798 to schedule your appointment

- This year's Tax-Aide program model requires that you drop-off your tax documents and meet with a Tax-Aide volunteer for an interview at time scheduled.
- You will return later the SAME DAY to pick up your completed return.
- If you are filing a joint return, both spouses must be present
 (Please schedule an appointment on a day that you, and spouse if applicable, are sure you are available to return later to pick it up).
- You will need to pick up an Intake Booklet packet and fill it out before your appointment.
 The packet includes Instructions and other forms that you will need to bring with you to your appointment.
- You can get the packet in the entrance area at the **Batavia Senior Center**, 2 Bank Street in Batavia. Packets are located in a box labeled "Community Action".

Puff Pastry Berry Hearts (makes about 18 hearts depending on the size of cookie cutter)

Prep Time: 5 mins Cook Time: 10 mins

1 cup whipping cream

1 teaspoon powdered sugar

1 package frozen puff pastry, defrosted

1/2 cup fresh raspberries (or mixed berries)

Preheat oven to 400°F.

Unfold the puff pastry and cut into hearts using heart-shaped cookie cutters.

.Place the puff pastry hearts on a baking sheet and bake for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown.

In the bowl of a standing mixer, or with an electric mixer whip the cream on medium- high speed for 2-3 minutes. Add the powdered sugar and beat on high for 30 more seconds or until thick and fluffy.

. Remove hearts from the oven and allow to cool completely. Slice hearts in half. Top the bottom half with whipped cream and berries, and place the other half on top to form a sandwich.
