Happy Spring! I hope everyone is doing well. I just returned from Head Start Fiscal training. Head Start and Early Head Start is our largest program so understanding the fiscal complexities is important. One of the subjects was internal controls and how it is vital for programs like Head Start and Finance teams to have good communication and proper segregation of duties. Throughout the training it was repeated that we should always base our spending decisions on data. It is important to do a periodic needs assessment and to tailor the programs and services we offer on where the greatest needs are, coupled with where resources are available to meet those needs. We will be working on our community needs assessment later this year. Pertaining to segregation of duties, it is critical that a staff member is not performing duties that could pose a risk. For example, the same person should not process accounts payable and accounts receivable. We are working on restructuring to ensure we have adequate staffing levels to separate these types of functions so there are no actual or perceived conflicts.

With that, I am excited to share with you that on April 3rd, we will have a new Chief Financial Officer. Tom Costa has accepted the position of Director of Finance and Administration. Tom comes to us from Normal Communications where he has served as CFO since 2003. He has a broad range of business, finance, and technical experience and is working on completing his Ph.D. in Business Administration. Tom currently holds a Master's degree in Business Administration and a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration / Finance. His wealth of experience will be extremely valuable as we transition into our new accounting system. Please join me in giving Tom a warm welcome!

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




