April was a busy month full of announcements so I thought I would review some of these in our May newsletter in case you missed anything.

This year our Annual In-Service program will take place on June 16th. The theme will be "Helping People, Changing Lives - celebrating the way we change and evolve to meet the needs of the community". The event will be held at the Albion Elks Lodge. Our special guest speaker will be former State Assembly Member, Charlie Nesbitt. We will also have speakers to discuss safety. Sadly, it seems every day there is something in the news about hate crimes, violence, and tragedy. We want to do everything we can to keep people safe and stop the hurt and senseless killing. With that, our Leadership and Risk/Safety Committees are working hard to improve security to ensure that staff and customers are as safe as possible. One important step we can take to keep our building occupants safe is to wear an identification badge. Many of you also have a building access FOB which we are looking to expand to all buildings as well as panic buttons that will bring help when needed. Please be aware that our policy requires that all staff wear their employee badges while working. If you don't have an employee badge, please see your manager.

Over the past three years, you have all demonstrated resiliency and commitment to our community and agency while dealing with COVID-19. Weathering a pandemic is no easy feat and many of you stood on the frontlines to ensure that people who needed services and assistance received it. You should all be proud of the fortitude and courage that you demonstrated through a very difficult time. As part of President Biden's six-point plan, mandates were put in place for teachers and staff of Head Start and Early Head Start programs, to be vaccinated for COVID-19. Achieving herd immunity was an important milestone in managing the pandemic so on January 1, 2022, Community Action of Orleans and Genesee also imposed a mandate for all employees to become fully vaccinated for COVID-19. That mandate has served its purpose we have recently learned that as of April 7, the Head Start mandate has been vacated. As such, in April I presented to the Board of Directors, a recommendation to end the agency mandate for COVID-19 vaccination. The Board voted and approved the recommendation. Effective April 18, 2023 Community Action of Orleans and Genesee will no longer require employees to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 as a condition of employment.

On a lighter note, in 2023, the 4th of July falls on a Tuesday. Our policy allows me the option to designate one additional holiday closure of the agency each year. To celebrate better weather coming our way and all the fun things that come with summer, I have declared Monday, July 3rd, 2023 an agency holiday so we can enjoy the long weekend into Independence Day. Thank you for your commitment to our agency and the communities that we support. I hope you are able to enjoy this extra time off with friends and family.
