Hello Team:

Since I have joined the agency, I have spoken quite a bit about the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH). This is the work that community based organizations (CBOs), like us, do to promote health and wellness. This focus on health and wellness, in programs like our Axis of Care program, helped to position us for something called the Medicaid 1115 waiver that has been talked about for quite some time. On January 9th, I was surprised to learn that this waiver was finally passed! So, what does this mean for us?

First, the term SDOH has been updated to HRSN or Health Related Social Needs. This was done to better define the services that are specific to health outcomes. Examples are the availability of healthy food, having shelter, and having access to hygiene items. Services that provide these things are an important part of overall health care but traditionally, insurance payers do not reimburse for these services. The idea behind the waiver is that for Medicaid customers, CBOs get to claim a share of these payments. It is still very early in the program so there are many unknowns. Fortunately, I sit on the board of the Finger Lakes Performing Provider System which has been heavily involved in this waiver. This will be very helpful in us keeping our finger on the pulse of this program.

For now, here is a summary of what the New York Medicaid 1115 waiver means for CBOs:

Waiver period: April 2024 – March 31, 2027 Amount approved: \$6.7 Billion.

NYS will use this Waiver to: * Advance health equity * Reduce health disparities * Support the delivery of health-related social needs * Promote workforce development

- Investments in HRSNs via greater integration between primary care providers and community-based organizations with a goal of improved quality and health outcomes.
- Improve quality and outcomes of enrollees in geographic areas that have a longstanding history of health disparities
 and disengagement from the health system, including through an incentive program for safety net providers with
 exceptional exposure to enrollees with historically worse health outcomes and HRSN challenges.
- Focus on integrated primary care, behavioral health, and HRSN with a goal to improve population health and health equity outcomes for high-risk enrollees including kids/youth, pregnant and postpartum individuals, the chronically homeless, and individuals with substance use disorder.
- Workforce investments with a goal of equitable and sustainable access to care in Medicaid; and
- Developing regionally focused approaches, including new value-based payment programs, with a goal of statewide
 accountability for improving health, outcomes, and equity. www.fingerlakes1115waiver.org

FUN FACTS ABOUT OUR COMMUNITIES



- Orleans County was founded in 1824: Before Orleans County was established, the territory was part of Genesee County. In January 1824, the New York State Legislature created Orleans County, which was named after the French city of Orleans.
- 2. Genesee County was founded in 1802 and was named after the Genesee River, which flows through the county and into Lake Ontario. The river played a significant role in the county's development, facilitating transportation and providing power for mills and factories.
- 3. Orleans County played an important role in the War of 1812: The War of 1812 was a conflict between the United States and Great Britain that took place from 1812 to 1815. Orleans County was the site of several notable battles, including the Battle of the Twelve Mile Creek, which took place in June 1813.
- 4. Genesee County is home to the oldest county fair in New York State, the Genesee County Fair, which has been held annually since 1841. The fair features a variety of agricultural exhibits, musical performances, carnival rides, and food vendors.

Genesee County Procedures

Former Governor Andrew Cuomo issued Executive Order 151 in 2016 which enacted Code Blue policies. These policies provide guidance to ensure that all homeless individuals in NY have shelter when the temperature is **32 DEGREES OR BELOW** – including windchill.

Every county has an individual Code Blue Plan. Per Genesee County's plan, placements are done through DSS. Please note that this does not eliminate the screening process DSS uses to determine the availability of other resources to meet the individual's needs.

- During business hours, 9-4 Monday-Friday, individuals can go to the Salvation Army to get out of the cold. The office may occasionally close early on Thursdays.
- During Code Blue, law enforcement will approach individuals appearing to be homeless after hours and offer a referral for shelter. If the individual accepts, Sheriff's Office will contact the DSS on-call worker.
- If an individual refuses shelter assistance during Code Blue and MH concerns are present, call Care + Crisis Helpline at 585-283-5200 and ask to speak to Genesee County on-call MH worker.
- After business hours, Sheriff's office to transport client(s) to housing placement if needed.
