Thanks to a generous donation from Harris Seeds, we will again offer free vegetable seeds and seedlings to the community. We are also planning to start our community garden behind the Head Start "Yellow House" in Albion. Planting will be in late May/early June.

Interviews for our new Head Start Director are underway. With the new Director in place, we will do some minor reorganization. HR will move under the leadership of Tina Schleede. We are fortunate that Tina is a certified HR professional. CCR&R and ACT will move under the leadership of Jackie Dunham. The new director will be the Director of Head Start, which includes Head Start, Early Head Start, and Head Start Child Care Partnership.

You often hear me talk about us addressing the social determinants of health. These are the non-medical factors that have a large influence on health outcomes and include the work we do like providing nutrition, housing, education, and other support. These factors are also called Health Related Social Needs (HRSN). Population Health is the interdisciplinary approach to achieving positive health outcomes within a community. This is the important work that we do. I am excited to have been invited to join Coral Health Advisors and Continual Care Solutions in a podcast on Population Health. I will share a link once it is released.

Finally, save the date....June 14th is our annual in-service. We are going to have speakers from all agency programs so we can all learn what each program offers so we can better work together as a team to provide wraparound support to our customers. I am looking forward to seeing all of you. Thank you for all that you do!

FREE online certification courses for Genesee County Residents

Wednesday, April 10, 2024 Adult Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) Training 9am - 3:30pm

Teaches people how to recognize signs of mental health or substance use challenges in adults ages 18 and older.

Topics covered include anxiety, depression, psychosis, addictions, how to offer help and guide a person toward appropriate care.

This blended course requires 2 hours of self-paced pre-work before attending an instructor-led virtual class.

Tuesday. April 23, 2024 Youth Mental Health First Aid (yMHFA) Training 9am - 2:30pm

Course is for adults who interact with adolescents (age 12-18) experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders, disruptive behavior disorders and eating disorders.

This blended course requires 2 hours of self-paced pre-work before attending an instructor-led **virtual** class.
