Community Needs Assessment

Introduction

In 1965, the Board of Supervisors chairman in Orleans County was appointed to a committee to examine different ways Orleans County could join the "War on Poverty" movement. An action committee was formed to study local needs for housing, migrant labor, and youth training, as well as problems facing older Americans. An agency was formed under the name Orleans Community Action Committee, Inc., or OCAC. In July 1965, anti-poverty programming began with: Head Start, Family Planning, Legal Aid, Neighborhood Youth Corp., and People's Opportunity.

In those first few years, Head Start and later CHAP (Children's Health Assurance Program) were formed to teach children and help with good health practices, along came our satellite office in Holley, (Eastern Orleans Community Center) to assist with senior Citizens and preschoolers, CATS (Community Action Transportation System) to transport senior citizens, and CARES (Community Action Resource & Educational service) which was a mobile van travelling the County informing residents of the programs available under the newly formed Orleans Community Action Committee.

In December 2007, the Board of Directors decided to change the agency's name to Community Action of Orleans & Genesee to unify the agency's image and better reflect its service area. The new name became official in February 2008, and the Board adopted a new logo in the spring.

Since 1965, some programs were spun off and other programs and services were extended into Genesee County. Our current programs include Head Start/Early Head Start and Early Head Start Childcare Partnership, Child Care Resource and Referral, Main Street Corner Thrifts, Gifts and More, Weatherization, Cooling, Case Management, Transportation, Axis of Care, Stone Soup, Caregivers Revitalize, Eastern Orleans Community Center, and many other services.

Community Action of Orleans and Genesee's Board of Directors approved 2023-2024 operating budget is \$7.35M. The agency currently operates with a combined full and part-time staff of 100 employees and total compensation (wages and benefits) of \$4.85M. The agency receives revenue from several sources including federal, state, county and local foundation funds, fees for service, private foundations, and gifts. The budget included an approved Indirect Cost rate of 13.6% for services related to all agency programs.

Community Assessment

As a Community Action Agency (CAA), CAOG is required to complete a Community Assessment every three (3) years. The purpose of the assessment is to determine local needs, identify opportunities and gaps in available services, and provide a basis for planning for the services that are necessary to mitigate the causes of poverty within our community and help people reach self-sufficiency and economic security.

The organizational standards of the Community Service Block Grant (CSBG) require that a community assessment include both quantitative and qualitative data specific to poverty. The community assessment must also include the input of stakeholders within the community including consumers of our services and consider customer satisfaction data.

Methodology

To complete this assessment, information was collected from various data sources. NYSCAA's Comprehensive CARES Engagement tool was used to generate a report that gathered data from current census and other local, state, and federal data sources.

The Community Needs Assessment process utilized the following methodologies:

- Collect and analyze relevant census and social indicator data
- Surveys distributed by CAOG with community members (79 total), CAOG staff, Board members, and volunteers 58 total), and community partners in both Orleans and Genesee Counties (37 total). Surveys were administered on both a paper and online version. Feedback from these surveys is integrated into the report.
- Community needs and priorities have also been identified through ongoing staff participation in community
 events, outreach, and forums; the information gleaned from those opportunities are included in this
 assessment.

This assessment includes data for both Orleans County and Genesee County and both counties combined, referred to as the "report area". Data for smaller municipalities in the county is included where available and applicable.

When referencing US Census Bureau data, American Community Survey Five Year 2017-2021 estimates were used in order to present the most accurate picture of community need. 5-year estimates are released annually and are recommended for analyzing small populations. The US Census Bureau has changed the way it collects Census data since the 2000 US Census. Instead of the decennial long-form, the Bureau now conducts annual data collection activities via the American Community Survey. The American Community Survey yearly estimates are based on roughly 2% of the population; the 3-year estimates are based on roughly 6% of the population, and the 5-year estimates are based on roughly 10% of the population. As a result, demographers recommend the use of the 5-year ACS data and caution strongly against year-to-year comparisons. In this report, there are some cases where data was only available in the one year or three-year estimates so that data was used and is noted as such. Additional national, state and local sources were utilized and are noted throughout the report.

COVID-19

In March 22, 2020, as COVID-19 spread across the nation in February and March, Governor Andrew Cuomo signed an executive order on March 22, 2020, called "New York State on PAUSE". Although the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency established by the Department of Health and Human Services ended on May 11, 2023. Our nation and community continue to struggle with COVID related illness and other related challenges such as job loss, homelessness, mental illness, and misinformation.

Satisfaction Data

A requirement when conducting a needs assessment is to gather satisfaction data from current program participants which is considered when determining recommendations.

Community Action of Orleans and Genesee collected a total of 44 surveys. Responses from the program participants to the 2022-2023 client satisfaction survey are:

- 44 (93%) respondents felt that they were treated with dignity and respect by the staff and/or volunteers.
- 44 (95 %) respondents identified completely meeting their goal or purpose for coming into the agency.
- 44 (93%) report receipt of information about other programs at Community Action while 7 (16%) reported being referred to information or other agencies or resources other than Community Action to assist in meeting their goal.

44 (95%) respondents reported they are likely to recommend Community Action services to friends, family and neighbors 44 (95%) respondents reported staff and volunteers as helpful and 44 (95%) rated the quality of their experience as very satisfied. The following are the responses to "which Community Action Programs have you participated in during the last year": 10 Transportation, 8 Holley Lunch Program, 1 ACT, 2 CCR&R, 24 Emergency Services (food, clothing, utilities, etc.), 4 Main Street Corner Store, 5 Weatherization, 5 Head Start/EHS (0-5), and 0 EHSCCP Program.

Key Findings

Although between 2010 and 2020, the New York population grew 4.25%, the CAOG service area continues to decline. During the same period the overall decline is 4.11% with Genesee falling by 2.81% and Orleans by 5.92%. In general, people who move away are those with the financial means to move so this decline may have an exacerbating impact on the poverty rate. Poor health outcomes and high mortality rates may also be a contributing factor.

- In 2020, out of the total population living in Orleans and Genesee counties, 11.84% of the population live below the poverty line. This is lower than the national average of 12.63%. At 2.9% (2023), Orleans and Genesee County unemployment rate is lower than state and national averages. Orleans is 3.5% and Genesee 2.6%. Genesee is likely lower due to a higher number of employment opportunities within the city of Batavia.
- The high school graduation rate in Orleans County is concerning at 75.91% in comparison to Genesee at 93.10% with New York at 87.03%. The Orleans dropout rate is 6.14%,
- Public transportation is limited in both counties.
- According to the U.S. Census, there were a total of 44,449 housing units in the report area in 2022, an increase of 356 (or 0.81%) since 2013 compared to a 319.16% increase statewide. Housing stock is aging with most built before 1960 with a median year of build in early 1950s.
- Rent is disproportionately high in Orleans County.
- According to the Homeless Alliance of Western NY the 2020 estimated total count of unsheltered customers in Orleans has decreased, while Genesee has remained consistent. This is attributed to the pandemic both because fewer people were in need and tracking was difficult at that time. The data compiled for three counties, Genesee, Orleans and Wyoming, shows that single adult households make up 73.9% of clients seeking shelter through DSS. Single female parents make up 18%. Data on homelessness is often skewed by differing definitions and a population for which it can be difficult, if not impossible, to capture data. It should be noted

- that the staff observations indicate that homelessness has become more prevalent and unsheltered individuals are more visible throughout both counties.
- According to Feeding America, Orleans County has a food insecurity rate of 10.4%. 84% of Orleans County residents are under the SNAP threshold of 200% poverty. In 2022, the CAOG Orleans County pantries were utilized 1,263 times by 672 customers. Through November 15, 2023, Orleans County pantry was utilized 1,672 by 880 customers. Genesee County has a food insecurity rate of 9.6%. 78% of Genesee County residents are under the SNAP threshold of 200% poverty. In 2022, 531 customers utilized the CAOG Genesee County pantry 849 times. Through November 15, 2023, 580 customers utilized the pantry 979 times.
- Orleans County has about 4.78 % with no broadband access, while Genesee has 4.44%. Emergency broadband benefits are being received by 3,557 households in Orleans County and 4,890 in Genesee County.
- Opioid/addictions Genesee Orleans Wyoming Opioid task force reports an overall increase in Opioid overdose deaths between 2015 – 2020. The number of participants trained in Narcan/Naloxone nearly doubled between 2015 and 2021, as did kit distributions.
- Teen births in Orleans County (5.44%) are higher than the state average of 3.02%.
- According to the American Community Survey 2023, there is only 1 physician for each 13,330 individuals in Orleans County. Orleans county ranks 55 out of 62 New York Counties for poor health outcomes and factors. Genesee comes in at 42.
- Eligibility for many funded programs focus on populations of extreme poverty and are prohibitive to the ALICE population. This poses a significant barrier to our mission of helping people to become self-sufficient as taking even a minimum wage job can create a termination of services. The system seems to be doing the opposite of what is intended.
- Mentioned in the survey and also an identified issue at NYSCAA Execute Director sessions, Community Action lacks brand recognition. Many agencies operate under a DBA and people often state they do not know what the agency does.
- The community survey indicates top needs as
 - Food Assistance (46.83%)
 - Financial Assistance (25.32%)
 - Weatherization (20.25%)
 - Home Repair (20.25%)
 - Health Care (12.66%)
 - Childcare (12.66%)
- Other concerns noted include Family Counseling, Financial Literacy, and Mental Health.

Identified Needs

The community assessment found the greatest needs and concerns in the following areas:

- There is a lack of affordable and accessible childcare that meets the need of households in Orleans and Genesee Counties, especially for employed essential workers beyond the COVID-19 pandemic.
- There is a lack of health care providers in both Orleans and Genesee counties (i.e. hospitals).
- The agency can play a larger role in addressing Health Related Social Needs to improve health literacy, reduce healthcare costs, and improve health outcomes.
- There is an increased need to coordinate efforts among providers to address food insecurities in Orleans and Genesee counties as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- There is an increased need to assist households with the delivery of food and household items or transportation to resources with food and household items, who have limited or no other means to assist in obtaining resources to address food insecurities.

- Orleans County is considered to be a "food desert" where there are little to no nutritional food options available (i.e. fast-food restaurants available with limited healthy, nutritional options to choose from).
- Low-income residents of Orleans and Genesee Counties lack financial literacy skills to manage their resources.
- The CAOG services may not be accessible to remote areas of the counties served by CAOG, especially if there is no available transportation.
- Low-income residents lack funds outside of their monthly income to pay for some items such as vehicle maintenance, house repairs, utilities, household (including pet food), and hygiene items.
- Orleans County dropout rates are high which correlates to lower income and risk of poverty.
- Public transportation is limited to route based services.
- There is limited available housing stock, and most homes are aging and in need of costly repair.
- Places to shelter and assist unhoused individuals are scarce.
- CAOG staff need to enhance their skills in specific areas such as the use of technology and fund development.
- Opioid addictions continue to take lives. Education and prevention is key.
- Orleans County continues to struggle with high teenage pregnancy rates.
- Current eligibility guidelines do not support the ALICE population.
- Community Action lacks brand recognition which impedes donations and a true community understanding of what the agency does for the community.

Recommendations

As a result of the community needs assessment, the following have been identified as recommendations:

- Continue driving the agency to breakdown silos and act as one agency providing wraparound services along with partners which the goal of helping people to become self-sufficient.
- Continue support and advocacy to ensure that working parents have access to safe and affordable daycare.
- Expand health related programs to enhance health literacy, address Social Related Health Needs, and partnership with health providers. Increase involvement with the NYHER Medicaid 1115 waiver to position the agency for potential Medicaid reimbursement. Explore acute care clinic opportunity.
- Explore additional food sources and partnerships to meet increasing demand for food. Explore avenues which may help customers grow their own food.
- Continue or expand programs which help customers to make healthy food choices.
- Pursue additional opportunities to promote financial literacy.
- Participate in partner programs to increase affordable housing and reduce homelessness.
- Explore expanding the Credit Recovery program to more Orleans County schools to increase high school graduation rates.
- Invest in agency education in fund development and grant management.
- Act as a community partner in preventing unnecessary death from overdose. Become a distribution site for fentanyl and xylazine test kits, naloxone, and educational materials. Enhance partnership with UConnectCare.
- Continue and strengthen agency advocacy of increasing eligibility rates so working people in the ALICE population can access resources.
- Increase marketing, success stories, community involvement, and relationship building to increase brand awareness and public understanding of the important role the agency serves. Focus and report outcomes.
- Seek and develop social enterprise opportunities to increase non-grant dependent revenue and increase agency stability.

About Community Action of Orleans & Genesee

CAOG offers a wide range of programs and services to meet the needs of low-income residents of Orleans and Genesee Counties. Services are provided at various locations throughout both counties. In addition to the CAOG Main Offices in Albion and Batavia, CAOG has established locations in four communities and five Head Start/Early Head Start sites. The programs and services available include emergency services (food, transportation, and clothing) as well as Case Management to assist the family in setting and obtaining goals of self-sufficiency. Case Managers utilize a strength-based approach, believing all families have strengths and a desire to be independent and successful.

CAOG Programs include:

ACT – Helping Youth ACT Responsibly

ACT provides a 6-8 hour evidence-based curriculum, "Making Proud Choices", to groups of youth (11-21 years old), in Orleans and Genesee Counties. Through the implementation ACT strives to help teens:

- Delay initial sexual encounter
- Make responsible decisions
- Lower teen pregnancies
- Reduce sexually transmitted diseases/infections

As of July 2023, an additional component of service is being provided in select school districts for a small group of youth, to address a health-topic related to their school and community. They will meet weekly and select the topic as well as propose solutions. Through this experience they will gain confidence and be able to advocate for themselves.

Transportation- for senior citizens and disabled individuals

The Transportation program is committed to providing reliable access to those programs and services which promote health and independent living. Operations include demand services on a year-round, five day/week basis. Buses are wheelchair accessible, and drivers provide door-through-door personalized assistance. Typical destinations include Mental Health, Community Partners, Office of the Aging meal programs, doctor appointments, treatment centers, dialysis, clinics, and healthcare facilities.

The transportation program's value to the community extends beyond procuring the resources necessary to establish a fleet of buses and pool of drivers, it has evolved to serve three more functions: keeping a watchful eye on elderly customers' well-being, directing riders to community resources and helping to preserve their quality of life. Without a public transit system, rural residents are vulnerable in many ways. The program offers low cost effective, dependable, courteous services in all types of weather conditions to those who might otherwise remain isolated.

The success of this program is due in part to the experience of its staff. They have maintained an excellent relationship with providers and the general public. The drivers are experienced professionals. Their dedication is demonstrated by the active part they play in assuring that vehicles are properly maintained, and by their impressive lengths of service.

CCR&R – Child Care Resources and Referral

Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) is a community-based organization that provides a variety of services related to childcare. CCR&R does not provide childcare programs itself. Instead, they offer services that are helpful to parents, childcare providers, employers and the community. CCR&R is available to all, regardless of race, color, sex, religious beliefs, national origin or handicapping conditions.

CCR&R assists parents in finding quality child care, based on the unique needs of their family, such as geographic location, age of child or time of day. Our services are free of charge and parents can contact CCR&R as many times as

needed to find care for their family, all information given to CCR&R is kept strictly confidential. Additionally, CCR&R assists providers in becoming licensed, receiving grants to purchase needed items, administer trainings, provide health care consultations and offer technical assistance. CCR&R helps the community by providing referrals to and support for necessary childcare which working parents need to maintain their jobs. We supply businesses with our brochures, and resources and advocate for the importance of quality care in all modalities.

Emergency Services/Case Management

Emergency Services are provided on a walk-in and referral basis. All sites have an emergency food pantry available to help in crisis situations. Emergency Services can also coordinate transportation; assist with clothing, rental payments, utility payments and counseling referrals. Emergency Services require an intake and interview process that may find the family could benefit by enrolling in Case Management.

The goal of Case Management is to assist families in becoming as independent and self-sufficient as they possibly can. This can include assistance in employment, education, parenting, and nutrition. Financial management and health and safety may also be addressed.

The Case Managers are trained professionals who will meet the consumer on a regular basis, either at the office, or at the consumers' home. The consumer and case manager will work together on identifying goals and how to reach the goals once made. The case manager will provide information, advocacy, and help explore alternatives with providing support to the family. Case Managers will make referrals if needed to appropriate agencies.

Early Head Start Child Care Partnership Program

The Early Head Start Child Care Partnership promotes partnerships and resources to provide comprehensive, quality services in childcare centers and group family day care sites for income-eligible families with infants and toddlers.

This federally funded program, which began in 2015, is for infants and toddlers (birth-3yrs) of income eligible parents who are working, in job training or school and are in need of full day / full year quality childcare. Currently there are 6 childcare partners providing maximum health, growth and development opportunities for 58 infants / toddlers within Orleans, Genesee and eastern Niagara Counties. Day Care Centers and Group Family Day Care Homes are partnered with Early Head Start to enhance services and ensure federal performance standards and regulations are followed for eligible children.

Head Start/Early Head Start

This a free program of Community Action of Orleans and Genesee, Inc. funded through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. A minimum of 90% of the total enrolled children must meet low-income eligibility standards, and at least 10% must be children with diagnosed disabilities. We provide services for both Head Start Preschool (ages 3 and 4 years old) and for Early Head Start-classrooms for Toddlers aged 18 months to 3 years and a small number of Home-based slots for 6 weeks to 3 years.

The program offers comprehensive services to children and families, which promotes literacy skills and social, mental, emotional, and physical needs. Parents are the cornerstone of the Head Start Program. The Head Start staff recognizes that parents are the child's first teachers. We encourage parent involvement in all aspects of programming from classroom volunteers to serving on decision-making committees.

Head Start offers:

- Kindergarten readiness skills
- Hot nutritious meals
- Health screening & Community referrals
- Safe settings
- Transportation in some areas
- Non-violent problem-solving skills
- Day Care referrals for children and siblings

Main Street Corner Thrifts, Gifts, and More

The Main Street Corner Thrifts, Gifts, and More Store is a quality retail business, which also provides comprehensive job training, employment support services, and education opportunities for residents of Orleans and Genesee Counties.

Employment services include resume building, job searches, job skills training, on the job work experience, and certificate courses. Albion High School students have the opportunity to make up course credits towards graduation as well as GED preparation, high school and college tutoring, and personal income/expense planning through our Credit Recovery Program.

The store provides free access to computers with online capability and volunteer opportunities from sales to merchandise processing and mentoring staff. We have also partnered with the Buffalo VA to support a Telehealth POD in the store where local veterans can come and use the secure and private POD to complete telehealth appointments with their VA doctors rather than traveling to Batavia or Buffalo.

Weatherization

The Weatherization Assistance Program is a free service to our customers who qualify. Insulation in the attic and sidewalls of the home is a high priority of the program. Some other measures include air sealing, weather-strip kits, door sweeps, carbon monoxide alarms and smoke alarms.

The Weatherization program is designed to help reduce the energy burden on our customers that qualify. This also gives families peace of mind knowing that the home is free from the dangers of carbon monoxide by testing all the appliances before and after the weatherization is completed.

Orleans and Genesee Counties Profile

Service Area

Community Action of Orleans & Genesee serves families and individuals residing in York Counties, Genesee and Orleans (see below), with a few programs and services County. The two-county area covers 885 service area is bordered in the north by Lake five Great Lakes, and in the south by the Finger Lake Region. Major urban cities

bordering eastern and western counties; Rochester to the east in Monroe County, Niagara Falls to the northwest in Niagara County, and Buffalo to the southwest in Erie County. The larger of the two counties, Genesee County (494 sq. miles) is divided into thirteen towns, six villages, and the City of Batavia. Orleans County (391 sq. miles) is divided into ten towns and five villages. The two counties, City of Batavia and local townships all have legislative jurisdiction over public works and budgets for locally funded services.



Population Change



Population Change, Percent by Tract, US Census Bureau 2010 - 2020







Median Age by Tract, ACS 2017-21













Percent Population with Income at or Below 200% FPL






Households Living Below the Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2017-21 __Over 20.0%















Population Below the Poverty Level, Children (Age 0-17), Percent by Tract, ACS 2017-21











Population Below the Poverty Level, Children (Age 0-4), Percent by Tract, ACS 2017-21













Ages 65 and Up Poverty Rate





Veterans, Percent of Total Population by Tract, ACS 2017-21











Non US Citizen Population, Percent by Tract, ACS 2017-21









Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2023 - July






















Population with No High School Diploma (Age 25+), Percent by Tract, ACS 2017-21









Hours per Week at Minimum Wage Needed to Afford Housing, 1-Bedroom (at FMR) by County, NLIHC 2021 $\,$










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Overcrowded Housing (Over 1 Person/Room), Percent by Tract, ACS 2017-21









Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2023 - July














2019 Total Deaths, Rate per 1,000 Population



























Percentage of Households with No Computer













I. Survey Results

Three surveys were conducted, Community Member Survey, Board, Staff, and Volunteer Survey, and Community Partner Survey.

Community Member Survey Results

A survey of CAOG customers was conducted from August 2023 through October 2023. Survey results identified the following areas as priorities for those individuals' seeking self-sufficiency. Seventy-nine responses were received, sixty-seven from Orleans County residents and twelve from Genesee County residents. Of the 79 responses, 39.24%) which is the equivalent of 25 respondents from Orleans County and 6 respondents from Genesee County, identified as not receiving services from CAOG in the past twelve months. This assisted in obtaining additional information from individuals who were receiving services from CAOG for the first time in one year.

The demographic portrait of the respondents is as follows: 35.82% of the respondents reported living in Albion and 33.33% of the respondents reported living in Batavia; 78.48% (53 from Orleans County and 9 from Genesee County) of the respondents identified as a woman; 98.73%

(66 from Orleans County and 12 from Genesee County) reported English as their primary language and identified as not being of Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin; 82.27% (54 Orleans County/11 Genesee County) reported using a car as primary mode of transportation, with 46.83% (32 Orleans County/5 Genesee County) reporting they are unable to afford their car repairs; 87.34% (57 Orleans County/12 Genesee County) reported that there is at least one adult in their household who was employed in full time work; 29.11% (20 Orleans County/3 Genesee County) reported their employment was affected by the COVID-19 pandemic; 70.88% (48 Orleans County/8 Genesee County) reported having an annual income of less than \$40,000 (which is well below the median household income for the country). In addition, 6.32% (3 Orleans County/2 Genesee County) identified their estimated annual household income as more than \$80,000. When customers and stakeholders were asked to rank the top three needs their household's experienced within the last 12 months the combined counties identified:

- Food Assistance (46.83%)
- Financial Assistance (25.32%)
- Weatherization (20.25%)

Board, Staff, and Volunteer Survey Results

Surveys conducted from August 2023 through October 2023, identified the following areas as priorities for those individuals' seeking self-sufficiency. Fifty-eight (58) responses were received, 65.52% (38) identified residing in Orleans County and 22.41% (13) identified as residing in Genesee County.

The demographic portrait of the respondents is as follows: 84.48% (49) of the respondents reported being employees; 10.34% (6) of the respondents reporting being a member of the Board of Directors; 1.72% (1) of the respondents reported being volunteers; and 1.72% (1) of the respondents reporting being a Head Start Policy Council Member. Respondents from all three sectors of the board were represented in the survey (3.45% Customer/Low-Income, 3.45%

Public/Elected Official, and 5.17% Private/Community Member). All fifty-two respondents have been part of CAOG for 21 years or less with the majority of respondents falling in the 1-5 category (31.03%) and 6-10 category (22.41%). 37.93% of the respondents (22) were somewhat knowledgeable, 34.48% of the respondents (20) were very knowledgeable of CAOG's programs and services, and 24.14% (14) of the respondents stated they were extremely knowledgeable.

When board members, staff, and volunteers were asked to rank the most pressing needs of the low-income population in Orleans and Genesee Counties they identified:

- Family Counseling (58.33%)
- Safe, Affordable Housing (44.74%)
- Senior Citizen Services (42.31%)
- Summer Recreation (42.11%)
- Financial Assistance (40.00%)
- Food Assistance (39.29%)

When board members, staff, and volunteers were asked to rank the services that did not meet the demand in the counties, they identified:

- Family Counseling (47.83%)
- Safe, Affordable Housing (46.88%)
- Childcare (43.75%)
- Dental Care (42.31%)
- Financial Assistance (40.74%)
- Transportation (39.29%)

Additionally, respondents identified other services not meeting demand such as food assistance, health care, mental health services, and heating/utility assistance.

The board, staff, and volunteers were asked to rank the most challenging community issues that low-income households in Orleans and Genesee counties will face in the next three years and identified the following:

- Food Assistance (50.00%)
- Childcare (48.72%)
- Mental Health Services (47.37%)
- Transportation (46.67%)
- Family Counseling (42.86%)
- Safe Affordable Housing/Veteran Services (42.11%)

When asked about CAOG's mission statement, 74.14% (43) respondents believe it accurately represents the organization's work, while 25.86% (15) believe it somewhat represents the organization's work, and 0.00% (0) believes it does not represent the organization's work. With unlimited resources available, respondents believe the agency should focus on communication (46.55%), staff retention (44.83%), program development (43.10%), staff development (39.66%) and Leadership training (32.76%).

Community Partner Survey Results

A survey of CAOG community partners were disseminated in August 2023 through October 2023. Twenty-Five (25) responses were received, 4 (16.00%) from Orleans County and 17 (68.00%) from Genesee County.

The follow identifies the survey respondents:

- 36.00% (9) from community-based organizations
- 4.00 (1) Faith-based organization
- 16.00% (4) in healthcare
- 0.00% (0) from the private sector
- 16.00% (4) from the public sector
- 16.00% (4) from an education institution
- 12.00% (3) chose others and specified they were from child development center, library, and government.

- Childcare (61.54%)
- Mental Health Services (56.25%)
- Adult Education/ Literacy/ Family Counseling/Parenting Education/ Safe Affordable Housing/Veteran Services (50.00%)
- Safety Crime Prevention (45.45%
- Transportation (43.75%)

When asked to rank the services that did not meet the demand in Orleans and Genesee counties, they identified:

- Childcare (54.55%)
- Safe, Affordable Housing (52.94%)
- Parenting Education/Respite Care/Safety / Crime Prevention (50.00%)
- Veteran Services/Youth Programs/Mental Health Services (42.86%)

• Food Assistance (37.50%)

Respondents identified additional top services that are not meeting the demand in the counties such as dental care, heating utility assistance, and substance abuse assistance.

When asked to rank the most challenging community issues that low-income households in Orleans and Genesee counties will face in the next three years, community partners identified the following:

- Childcare (73.33%)
- Food Assistance (66.67%)
- Parenting Education (60.00%)
- Financial Assistance (46.67%)
- Heating / Utility Assistance (45.45%)

Additionally interesting, Community Partners from Orleans and Genesee County identified food assistance as the second most challenging community issue and heating /utility assistance as the least challenging community issue as described in the percentages above.

The community partners were asked if they were aware of any impending funding cuts or funding changes that will impact services.

- 6 (24.00%) of respondents said yes
- 19 (76.00%) of respondents said no

When asked if the community partners would be interested in being contacted to discuss new partnership and/or enhanced collaboration further, 48.00% (12) combined total for Orleans and Genesee County) responded yes and 52.00% (13) combined total for Orleans and Genesee County responded no.

II. Community Resources

Community Action of Orleans and Genesee has access to community resources for services not available at the agency, such as:

- The Department of Social Services in Orleans and Genesee counties who assist and assess households for temporary assistance determinations, child and family services (child protective services, adult protective services, foster care, preventive services, adoption, and domestic violence, job development, and child support.
- Pathstone Domestic Violence, YWCA of Genesee County, and/or RESTORE Sexual Assault Services are available for domestic violence situations.

Additionally, community resources that are available to assist community members with their needs are exhibited in the table below. The following chart summarizes the resources and any barriers to accessible the available resource within both counties. However, it is not an exhaustive list of all available community resources.
