This training explores the physiological as well as emotional impacts of traumatic experiences in childhood and how this impacts not only these individuals as adults...but potentially also their descendants. It is a fascinating topic that focuses on helping us understand how to help people who have experienced trauma, and how to build resilience and minimize the adverse effects. I will be presenting this topic at the Head Start staff development day event as well as a virtual session on Wednesday, November 20th and 2:30 pm. I will be sending more information in the NEAR (get it?) future on how to enroll. Please discuss with your manager before enrolling to ensure we have adequate staff coverage. If you do take this training, I ask that you complete an online course evaluation upon completion. I will send a link, via email, when I send the additional information about the training session.

Health benefits of quitting smoking over time.

Within minutes of smoking your last cigarette, your body begins to recover:

20 minutes

Your heart rate and blood pressure drop.



2 weeks to 3 months

Your circulation improves, and your lung function increases.



1-2 years

Your risk of heart attack drops dramatically.



5-10 years

Your risk of cancers of the mouth, throat, and voice box (larynx) is cut in half. Your stroke risk decreases.



15 years

Your risk of coronary heart disease is close to that of a nonsmoker.



A few days

The carbon monoxide level in your blood drops to normal.



1-12 months

Coughing and shortness of breath decrease. Tiny hair-like structures that move mucus ouf of the lungs (called cilia) regain normal function, increasing their ability to handle mucus, clean the lungs, and reduce the rust of infection.



10 years

Your risk of lung cancer is about half that of a person who is still smoking (after 10-15 years). Your risk of cancer of the bladder, esophagus, and kidney decreases.

Alishia traveled to Albany on October 22nd through the 23rd for the Stronger Together Forum focused on the Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) and Legally Exempt Enrollment Agency Staff

Once the gift has been brought to the store, we will contact the person who had entered it for pickup.

We did have our tree up last year and it was great to watch as the community stepped in to help each other, so this year I wanted to make it a bit easier for others to access. This year we have links so that the coupons can be purchased online for those who might not be able to make it in to the store. We will then make sure that they are all hung on our tree, and all wishes will be regularly updated to our Facebook page (again, completely anonymous). If we have extra coupons we will distribute them to other Community Action locations, and warming shelters to be given out.
